Frequently Asked Questions

Why are Saturday opening hours changing?

We are trialling a 7:00am Saturday opening in response to member feedback requesting earlier access to the facility. The trial aims to improve accessibility, reduce peak-period congestion and provide greater flexibility for members and guests.

When does the trial start and how long will it run?

The pilot will commence on Saturday 1 August 2026 and run for 13 weeks, concluding on Saturday 24 October 2026.

Who can access the facility from 7:00am?

Casual patrons and members with full facility access, including Aquatic, Premier and Wellness memberships, will be able to access the facility from 7:00am during the trial period.

Will limited membership access times change as a result of the trial?

No. Memberships with time-based access restrictions, including Teen and Staying Active memberships, will remain unchanged.

If you're unsure which membership you hold or would like to upgrade, our team will be more than happy to assist.

Will membership fees change as a result of the trial?

No. The trial will not result in any changes to membership fees beyond our standard annual fees and charges increase.



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What services will be available from 7:00am?

The following services will be available from 7:00am during the trial period:

- Health Club
- 50m Pool
- Warm Water Pool, Spa, Sauna & Steam Room
- Learn to Swim Pool
- Toddler Pool
- Saturday Group Fitness Classes (Yoga, Aqua Movers, CONNECT30)

Will the Aqua Play Zone hours change?

No. The Aqua Play Zone operating hours will remain unchanged.

Will Elements Eatery be extending its operating hours?

Yes. Elements Eatery will open earlier to support the extended weekend operating hours. Further details will be communicated via Elements Eatery's website, Facebook & Instagram prior to the commencement of the trial.

How will Yawa determine whether the trial is successful?

The trial will be monitored throughout the 13-week trial, with performance measured against attendance, participation, member feedback, operational impacts and financial outcomes. The findings will help inform any future decisions regarding permanent Saturday operating hours.
